Emile Faurie, European Team Gold Medallist will be visiting Bishop Burton College with his horses to give a lecture/demonstration on the Development of the Dressage Horse. The evening will be a valuable insight into Emile's Training techniques.

Emile who runs his own training livery yard in the Cotswolds has ridden in numerous International Championships at World/Olympic and European level and has trained many horses to Grand Prix having won Team European Gold/Silver and Bronze Medals and Individual European Bronze on 'Virtu'. In this busy year with the build up to the Olympics we are delighted Emile has found time to visit us.

Emile also has his own Foundation which helps to fund disadvantaged children throughout the UK to be able to ride and have contact with horses. The Emile Faurie Foundation which started in 2006 now funds over 6000 kids throughout the UK. Two of the projects from Newcastle and Hull will be invited to the Demonstration.

The performance will be held in the Bishop Burton Arena on Friday 3rd February, doors open at 6.30pm and the demonstration will start at 7.00pm.
