Find our eligibility guides in the Members' Handbook. These point you in the right direction for which competition section you and your horse can enter – Bronze, Silver or Gold.

Define your goals, choose your championship, then find out when and how to qualify. Remember, you can often use 'normal' shows to qualify for our championships, such as the Petplan Equine Area Festivals.

Choose your local show. Visit our website to view all competition schedules – you normally can enter online too. Why not follow your local venues on social media to keep an eye on fixture updates?

Learn your test and get riding! You can buy test sheets and plans from our online shop – or if you prefer a more interactive way of learning, try the Dressage TestPro app, it's free to download and trial!

Keep us up to date with your progress, share your stories on social media. Tag the BD accounts or use #BritishDressage – we're on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube.

Health and welfare

Vaccinations: All horses need to have a flu vaccination within six months and 21 days of the show they're attending. Check with your vet if you think your horse may be due soon!

Passports: Don't forget to always travel with your horse's passport; often you'll need to present this to the show secretary on arrival.

Health: Please always put your health and welfare first – do not travel to compete if you or your horse are feeling unwell.

Your safety: We require up to standard hat certificates, so make sure you've got a correctly fitting and up to standard helmet. Check your boots and equine leather wear too and remember to always ride responsibly within your ability.



If you're joining us under the age of 25, you'll become part of BD Youth.

Get involved with regional youth activity and teams. There's also the opportunity to aim for international squads, Under 21 National Championships at FEI level, or progress your skills with youth a cademies and courses, including the BD Horse Care programme.

Compete top tips for success

Warm up to win!

To help you get the most out of your warm up, we've compiled our best tips and some unwritten rules!

Pass other riders left hand to left hand.

If they're in counter canter, give way by circling.

Make tack adjustments outside the arena if possible.

Ensure your whip doesn't upset a passing horse.

Do not halt or walk on the outside track.

Trainers/supporters should not stand in warm up spaces.

Riders with impaired vision should wear a white armband.

Stewards may give priority if warm ups are overcrowded.

Be prepared, take an arena bag for boots/bandages and kit.

Ask a steward if you need help or assistance at any time.

The idea of affiliated competition can often be daunting – but it needn't be! BD's most experienced professionals have offered their advice to help you take the first step:

•

Enjoy your experience

You and your horse don't need to be at the venue for the entire day! You're allocated a specific time for your test, so it's completely up to you what time you arrive at the venue and how long your preparation is.

As the competition draws near. don't forget to collect times online or over the phone.

Remember to make a note of your competitor number, which you'll need to display using a bridle or saddlecloth number on both sides of your horse.

The judge will sound a horn or ring a bell to indicate that you should start your test. You have 45 seconds after the bell to enter the arena at A. Don't forget to smile!

- If you go wrong in the test, the judge will ring the bell. Don't panic! If you know where you've gone wrong, just raise your hand and return to the start of the move. If you aren't sure, ride towards the judge who'll tell you the error and where to restart. Most iudaes have been competitors themselves, so they'll understand!
- If you can, try and thank • the organiser before heading home; show days are always busy and we appreciate their work.
- <u>Once vou're home, put</u> • your feet up and congratulate yourself on what you've achieved! Read the judge's comments and choose some goals to work on before your next outing.

Your region our community

What to wear: The gear guide

Can't make up your mind on which saddlecloth to choose, or not sure if your boot colour is on point? Luckily BD is on hand to help you decide what you and your horse should wear for your competitions.

Horse equipment

- Saddles can be black, brown, grey or navy and English or Continental style, in leather or synthetic materials.
- Bridles must include a bit and noseband and can also be leather or synthetic in predominantly black, brown, grey or navy.
- Double bridles are allowed at Elementary and above.
- Ear covers and fly hoods, including noise reducing versions, are permitted for all indoor and outdoor competitions. They can't cover your horse's eyes and must be discreet in colour.
- Boots and bandages of any colour may be used for warming up, but make sure you remove them before entering the arena – don't forget your overreach boots too!
- Martingales and bit guards aren't allowed so make sure you take them off before competing.
- Whips may be carried but make sure you take care when riding closely to others.

Rider fashion

safety standards, in conservative colours like navy blue, black, grey and brown – plus coloured piping. These may be any conservative dark colour or tweed. Avoid bold stripes or multi-coloured outfits. shirts Long or short sleeved, not in bright or multi-coloured fabrics. Add a tie, American collar or correctly fitted stock.

bodv

Fitted styles and conservative colour waistcoats are permitted. No jackets are also allowed in extreme heat.

other

Breeches should be white, beige or cream, gloves can be any colour. Spurs are allowed at all levels, used correctly.



Quest to impress

Don't forget! The rules are slightly different for Saracen Horse Feeds Quest competitions. Here's what you could do if you're heading for Team Quest or My Quest competitions!

- Brightly coloured saddlecloths with your team name or horse name.
- Matching team polo shirts or gilets.
- All the bling! Add diamante to your saddle cloths or team outfits.
- Go casual, there's no need for a show jacket if you wanted to make the most of the relaxed rules.
- Matchy matchy! Sync up you and your horse's wardrobes with matching silks, shirts, ear covers and saddlecloths.
