## What should be reported?

The welfare of the individual is paramount. In order to assist British Dressage in upholding this principle, you are asked to complete the form for any issues/concerns or incidents. When completing the form please provide as much information as possible. Concerns may be about the behaviour of any child or adult involved or spectating at your event or training session and *could* include:

- General concerns about a child or vulnerable adult's welfare
- Concerns related to a safeguarding incident e.g. bullying or poor practice
- Concerns, suspicions or allegations of misconduct
- Breaches of the BD's Safeguarding Policy
- Allegations of abuse made by or against any child or adult

If you would like further details of what should be reported please refer to the *BD Safeguarding Policy* which can be found on Safeguarding pages of the BD website.

For further guidance if you are unsure whether you should report the concern please contact your Regional Development Officer, the Event's Nominated Welfare Officer, BD's Lead Welfare Officer or the BEF's Lead Safeguarding Officer.

In a situation where you feel an adult or child is at **immediate risk** please report the incident to the NSPCC or Police immediately.
